

At the Clinical Center, Nuclear Medicine Department, she explored the use of triplex-forming oligonucleotides for gene-targeted radiotherapy; and at the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases (NIAID), Laboratory of Cellular and Molecular Immunology, she investigated the mechanisms behind CD4 T cell tolerance and autoimmune disease. After twelve years at NIH, she moved to Honolulu to pursue a PhD in Tropical Medicine at the University of Hawaii at Manoa (UHM), learning about infectious diseases and gaining experience in clinical/translational and global health research. Her graduate research focused on human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) and human papillomavirus (HPV) co-infection among cohorts in Hawaii and Thailand. She is continuing her research career as a current Postdoctoral Fellow in the Department of Tropical Medicine, Medical Microbiology & Pharmacology at UHM with a focus on development of a recombinant subunit vaccine against Ebola HAWAII ADMINISTRATIVE RULES 11-157



sions to the proposed rules. The amended administrative rules will then be reviewed by DOH Administration and the Attorney General's Office prior to submission to the Governor's Office for signing. HAR 11-157 was last amended in 2001. Since then, updates have been made to the vaccine recommendations of the ACIP, resulting in differences between current national

standards and Hawaii's pediatric and school entry and attendance requirements. The proposed amendments conform with current national recommendations and update Hawaii's administrative rules to reflect what is already occurring in healthcare provider offices and clinics as standard medical practice.
